

Information and instructions on how to install your new 9-1-1 reflective address sign

For the \$30- 6" x 18" road signs you will need to purchase:

- One 6'-8' T-Post.
- Two U-Bolts approximately $1 \frac{1}{2}$ wide and $2 \frac{1}{2}$ long to attach to the T-Post.

For the \$20 - 4" x 12" house sign you will need to purchase:

• Screws or nails (as appropriate) for mounting to your structure

1. Recommended installation of 6" x 18" sign on T-post:

- a. Call 8-1-1 (call811.com) to have your utilities located before digging and installing your T-post.
- b. Choose a location that will not be in the path of snowplows or be buried under snow, is always visible from the road, and is not obscured by trees or bushes.
- c. If possible, your post location should be on the far side of your driveway as traffic approaches, and as close to the road at the end of your driveway as practical.
- d. Pound the T-post into the ground by inserting the U-bolts into the pre-drilled holes on either the left or right side of the sign. A left side attachment for installation at a property on the left side of the primary direction of travel is shown on the back of this page, image A.

2. Structure installation of 4" x 12" house sign:

- a. Choose a location that will be visible from the road by approaching vehicles and won't be obscured by bushes or trees. If you can't see the sign's chosen location from the road at 30 to 40 feet before the end of your driveway, mount the sign in a different location or obtain a post-mounted sign.
- b. Use hardware, such as screws or nails, that are appropriate for the material you are mounting the sign to.
- c. You can see an example 4" x 12" house sign on the back of this page, image B.
